Section 6 Accidental Release Measures

In case material is released/spilled: Wear appropriate safety equipment. Contain and clean up spill immediately. Prevent from entering floor drains. Contain liquids using absorbants. Sweep powders carefully minimizing dusting. Shovel all spill materials into disposal drums and follow disposal instructions. Scrub spill area with detergent and flush with copious amounts of water.

Safe Handling: In accord with good industrial practice, handle with care and avoid personal contact.

Section 8: Exposure controls and personal protection

General Protective Measures: Do not breathe dust. Avoid contact with eyes and skin. Immediately remove all contaminated clothing.

Eye Protection: Wear safety glasses with side shields or safety goggles.

Skin Protection: Wear chemical resistant rubber gloves and long sleeved clothing.

Respiratory Protection: Inhalation of dust and aerosols must be absolutely prevented by the use of a NIOSH approved dust respirator.

Other: Employees should avoid skin contact by wearing protective clothing. Long sleeve shirts, pants, gloves e.g. Of PVC or nitrile rubber, and boots are recommended. Additional protections such as impervious suits are recommended when the potential for dermal contact is significant.
